# Save the Date for the next Hot Topic Happy Hour 5:30-7:00pm Sunday, February 23

Hot Topic Happy Hour is a new adventure in adult faith enrichment, held on the fourth Sunday of each month from 5:30 to 7:00 pm. Patterned after gatherings that Martin and Katie Luther hosted in their home to discuss theology and everyday issues with friends and students, Grace Hall at church will be transformed into a *Table Talk Tavern* of sorts. Participants are invited to bring an appetizer or snack and beverage to share as we engage in meaningful dialogue about current topics, all rooted in our faith and trust in God's eternal love for all creation through Christ Jesus our Lord.

On Sunday, February 23, Director of Faith Formation Noelle Fox and Pastor Steve will moderate the ongoing conversation around Jonathan Haidt's research in the book *The Anxious Generation*. Whether or not you attended January's discussion, we will continue to explore the rise in anxiety and depression among the younger generations since the advent of the smartphone in 2010. Haidt identifies key contributors such as the rise of social media, overprotective parenting, and the decline of face-to-face community. In response to such challenges for the healthy socialization of children and youth, Haidt makes a case for the importance of resilience-building practices, face-to-face relationships, and teaching critical thinking to counter these trends. Together we will reflect on and discuss the practical insights he suggests for nurturing emotional and spiritual health across our community and among young people in particular. Advance reading/familiarization with the book is highly recommended. All friends and neighbors are encouraged to join us!

## **Empowerment Shelf – February 2025**

Amazing Grace: The Story of America's Most Beloved Song, Acts of Forgiveness, and Finding Junie Kim are books that I've read myself or seen as books of note. This literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We in Neighbor to Neighbor hope you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit. ...

Amazing Grace: The Story of America's Most Beloved Song by Turner, Steve.

Learn two stories about the famous song. The first is of its lyric writer, John Newton, who as a mentor of William Wilberforce, played a pivotal role in the abolition of the slave trade in Britain. The second recounts how the lyrics crossed the Atlantic, connected to a tune thought to have Scottish origins and became one of the most recorded songs.

#### Acts of Forgiveness by Cheeks, Maura.

In this debut about ambition, race, and class, a family grapples with how much of their lineage they're willing to unearth in order to participate in the nation's first federal reparations program. This novel ponders how history shapes who we are, to consider the weight of success when it is achieved despite incredible odds, and what leaving behind a legacy truly means.

#### Finding Junie Kim by Oh, Ellen.

Junie Kim just wants to fit in. So she keeps her head down and tries not to draw attention to herself. But when racist graffiti appears at her middle school, Junie must decide between staying silent or speaking out. As racism becomes more pervasive at school, Junie taps into the strength of her ancestors and finds the courage to do what is right. For grades 5-8.
